 - Revisions to clarify issues related to federal financial aid eligibility

Current language provided conflicting information regarding full-time status for the purpose of financial aid. The goal is to simplify and clarify enrollment requirements from the revision process. Likewise, there has been much confusion regarding how to handle prerequisite courses. The revised language provides guidance, particularly related to federal requirements and allowances for financial aid. In this proposal full-time and part-time is related to financial aid only. Preparatory coursework was addressed and must be included in a degree program. The document was shared in Graduate Council >2021-22>Feb10>OtherBus folder.
